

Higher Education in 2011-2012

- A total of 37,700 students were enrolled in the academic institutions of Jerusalem, representing about 15% of all students enrolled in academic institutions in Israel. A total of 20,600 students were enrolled at the Hebrew University, 11,400 at academic colleges, and 5,700 at five colleges of education.

Higher Education in 2010-2011

- During 2010-11, a total of 36,500 students were enrolled in the academic institutions of Jerusalem, constituting 15% of all students in Israel's academic institutions.
- Of these, about 20,400 students studied at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and they constituted about 56% of all students in Jerusalem; 10,800 students studied in academic colleges (30%), and another 5,300 studied in colleges of education.
- Categorizing students according to degree shows that of the 36,500 students who studied in academic institutions in Jerusalem, 71% pursued a first degree, 22% a second degree, 7% a third degree, and less than 1% pursued a teaching certificate.

Hebrew University students

- During 2010-11, a total of 20,400 students studied at the Hebrew University, of whom 55% pursued a first degree, 32% a second degree, 12% a third degree, and 1% pursued a certificate.
- The distribution of students at the Hebrew University by faculty is as follows: 27% in the social sciences, 23% in the humanities, 20% in the natural sciences and mathematics, 16% in medicine (including medical support professions), 8% in agriculture, 5% in law, and 1% in engineering and architecture.
